INTRODUCTION

For Gotham PD

Welcome to Gotham delegates, or more specifically, welcome to the Gotham Police Department (or Gotham PD/GPD/GCPD)! It is our responsibility to ensure the safety of the citizens of Gotham and to make this city a better place. However, there are a lot of problems which prevent us from fulfilling this goal. The first of these problems is the fact that the city is rife with crime. Crime rate has gone up substantially throughout the years due mainly to a corrupt and incompetent police force.

HISTORY/CONTEXT

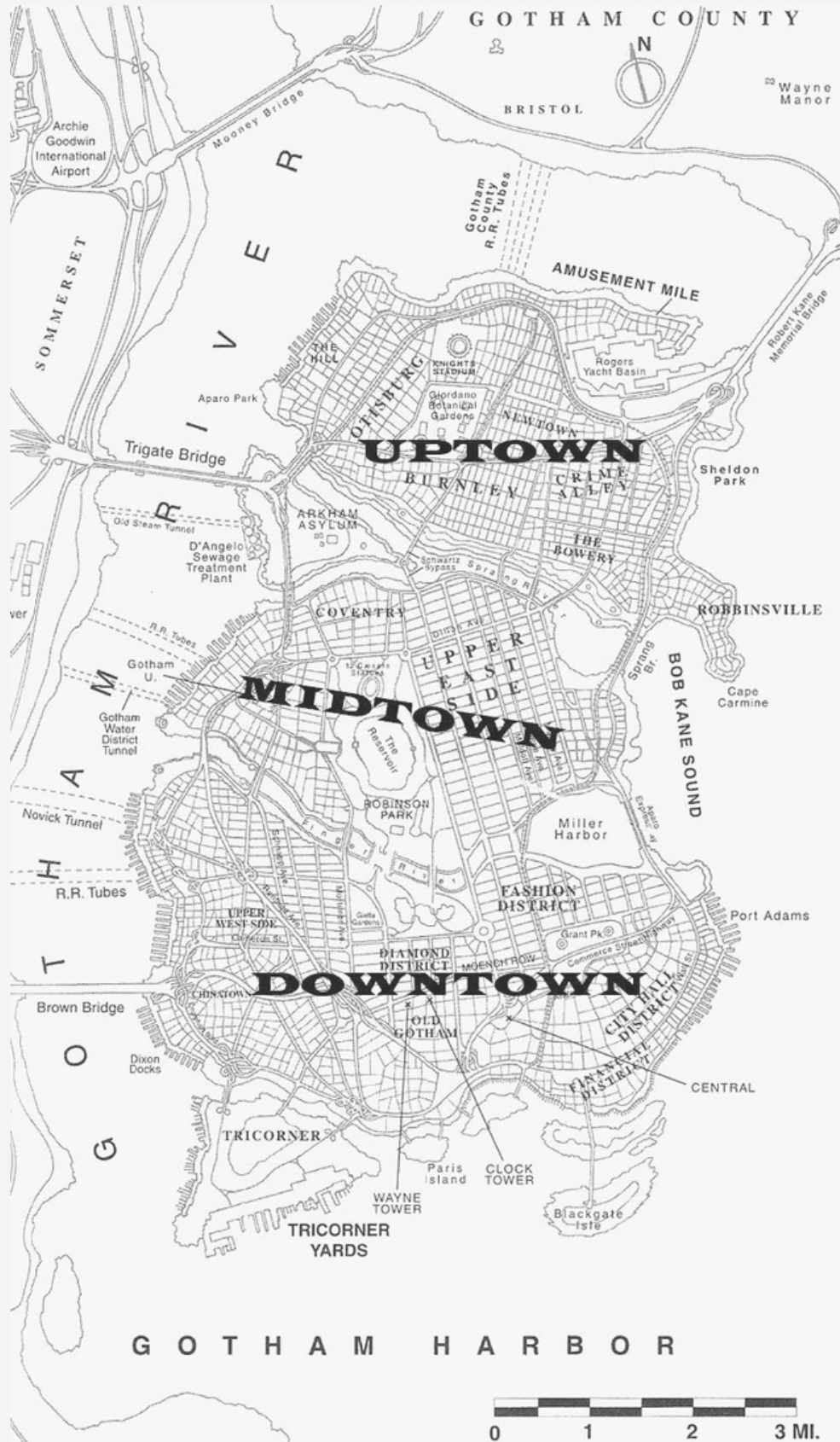
Gotham [Gaath-aam] is an old city full of history and rich with culture. However, in recent years, the light that once shined throughout the city has seemed to diminish. Crime is rampant and income inequality has left the poor hopeless. On the next page, there is a map of Gotham City. It is divided into three clear sections: Uptown, Midtown, and Downtown.

Downtown is the location of city official buildings, such as Wayne [Wayn] Tower, City Hall, and Gotham Police Station at Tricorner Island. It is where all the rich in Gotham Live, those who can't afford to live at the Palisades - an area outside of Gotham home to the wealthiest of the wealthiest.

Midtown is where all the business in Gotham is located, with the Upper East Side being known for being a bustling neighborhood full of businesses small and large. Although the financial district is where Gotham's Wall Street is located, the heart of commerce in Gotham is Midtown.

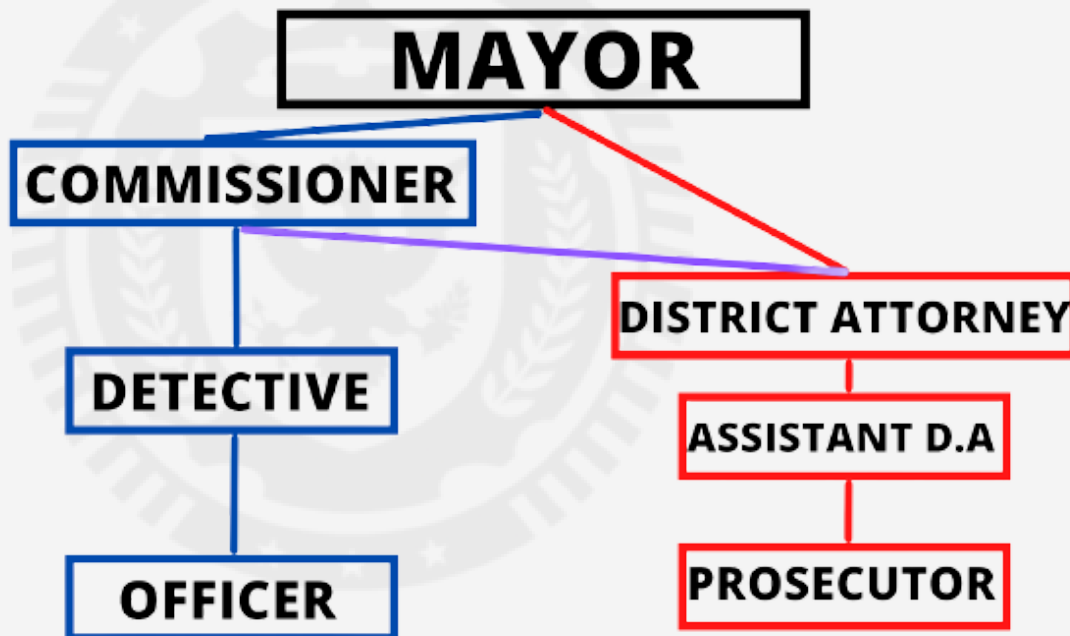
Uptown is mostly full of residential areas, with a few industrial areas, such as ACE Chemicals in the Hill, and tourist attractions, such as the Botanical Gardens and Knight's Stadium - Gotham's football team. However, it is also the poorest part of Gotham and home to the Narrows - a part of Gotham that is so underfunded and rampant with crime, that city officials have decided to call it "a lost cause". The Narrows include the neighborhoods of Robinsville, Crime Alley, Burnley, the Bowery, Robinsville, and Newtown. These areas are mostly run down or abandoned buildings, with the exception of Newtown, which has benefited from Wayne Enterprises' recent philanthropic efforts to help rebuild Gotham City.

The Gotham Police Department, or Gotham PD for short, has had a turbulent history with the public. It's a well-known fact that most of the Gotham PD have been corrupt. There have been rumors of police brutality as well as unjust officers for some time now. After a slew of corruption charges on Cops have been brought forward, the city has just realized the corruption inside Gotham PD. Yet there is still hope for the police department if it is able to deal with these corruption allegations. The hierarchy of Gotham PD is shown below. As you can see, there are two branches to the police force: the constabulary branch (blue) and the legal branch (red). The constabulary branch deals with arrests and criminal investigations.

The legal branch deals with the legal process of acquitting the criminals and internal investigation. When criminals are caught, they are arrested by the constabulary branch, and then prosecuted by the legal branch. Once they are proven guilty the suspects who go to prison are sent to one of two prisons: Blackgate Penitentiary or Arkham [Aar·km] Asylum. Blackgate is where common criminals are sent, and Arkham is reserved for the criminally insane. Delegates in the legal branch have the ability to investigate each other and the constabulary branch. Being higher on the hierarchy allows you to have more power and say in your crisis notes, and to be promoted you must either have the blessing of the Mayor.



A New Vigilante

He's vengeance, he's the night, he's none other than Batman. Recent rumors have circulated all throughout Gotham that there is a silent guardian, a watchful protector, a dark knight circulating the streets at night. Seeming to come virtually out of nowhere, he seems to be the hero the city desperately needs. He's cleaning up crime one neighborhood at a time, and because of him, the rate of crime seems to be dropping. He seems to have invoked hope in the citizens of Gotham. Yet it is up to us to decide whether we work with him or not. For it is nice to have a hero when we need one, but what could be the repercussions of the drastic measures Batman is taking?

Major Industries

ACE Chemicals

ACE Chemicals is known for creating hazardous chemicals for primarily industrial use. Pesticides, fertilizers, and cleaning agents are just a few of what they create here. However, the company is as toxic as the material they make. Located in The Hill, they are known for dumping chemicals into the Gotham river, and sometimes leaks from the factories can cause poisoning in the Downtown area of Gotham. However deadly the business is, it is the only place in America where you can get toxic chemicals of this stature in bulk and seems to be a wealthy business itself.

Daggett [Da-get] Industries

Daggett Industries is a pharmaceutical company located in the Fashion District. Their subsidiary GothCorp is devoted to helping humanity with anything, whether it is with food, new clothing, or electronics. This new company has quickly become one of Gotham's wealthiest businesses. However, its CEO and founder, Roland Daggett is known to coerce himself with prominent mob leaders, and it is questionable if their business practice is entirely ethical.

Wayne Enterprises

Wayne Enterprises, previously known as WayneCorp, is the wealthiest company in Gotham. The company is a huge multi-billion dollar conglomerate, with sub-industries such

as Wayne Technologies, Wayne Medical, Wayne Shipping, Wayne Entertainment, Wayne Food, Wayne Financial, and more. Under the current CEO Bruce Wayne, the company has prospered into one of the largest companies in the world, rivaled only by a few others like LexCorp. Being as old as Gotham itself, it has had a history of philanthropy with the city, with the recent addition of the Wayne Foundation caring for and helping out the less fortunate. Its headquarters is currently located in Old Gotham at the Wayne Tower.

Major Criminals

Maroni [Mor-oh-nee] Crime Family

Led by “Big” Lou Maroni, the Maroni crime family is known for being a ruthless crime family in Gotham. Although they have decreased in power over the years, they are still a formidable enemy. The rest of their organization is currently located in Downton Gotham, mostly around Crime Alley. They are responsible for the distribution of narcotics in Gotham, which seems to be the only thing keeping them in business. If we were to make an arrest on the head of the family, it would be a huge blow to the underground criminal world. Currently the majority of the Maroni Crime family is situated in the Narrows, with a war ensuing with the Falcone Crime Family over control of the Bowrey.

Falcone [Fal-co-knee] Crime Family

The Falcone Crime Family, or also known as “The Roman Empire”, after its leader Carmine “The Roman” Falcone, are the most powerful mafia in Gotham. They have essentially merged most of the crime families in Gotham under one “Roman Empire”, and are currently looking to integrate their last competitors, the Maroni Crime Family. They have gotten so powerful through the illegal distribution of firearms and illegal gambling.

If they were to control the Maroni Crime Family, they would have a virtual monopoly of crime in Gotham. It is clear that they must be stopped if we are to have any chance in tackling crime in Gotham City. Currently the majority of the Falcone Crime family is situated in the Coventry and Upper West Side, with a small presence in the Fashion District. They are currently in a war with the Maroni Crime Family over control of the Bowrey.

The League of Shadows

The League of Shadows is a group of assassins led by Ra's Al Ghul, and is meant to help restore the balance of civilization once it gets "too corrupt." It is stated that they have worked once with the villain "Scarecrow" - who utilizes a fear toxin to immobilize his enemies, and hire mercenaries like the brute "Bane." However, in recent days, the league is nothing more than a myth, as there is no tangible evidence proving its existence. It has been decades since people have even seen members of the league, and the last time that date in which their presence was recorded was in 1666 during the Great Fire of London.

The Joker

An agent of chaos, the Clown Prince of Crime is one of the most feared men in Gotham. Although relatively new to the scene - appearing sometime around Batman emerged - the Joker is a complete psychopath with no moral compass whatsoever. He disguises himself as a clown, and is most known for his chalk-white skin gained from a chemical accident at ACE Chemicals. His true identity is unknown, however, he is known throughout both the criminal underworld as a man who you do not want to mess with. His psychosis causes his personality to shift between a goofy prankster and a psychotic murderer. If Batman stands for justice, then the Joker is the opposite of him, and is a representation of what may happen with Batman's emergence into the crime-world.

TOPICS OF DEBATE

Topic #1: Police Force

It's a well-known fact that most of Gotham's cops are either incompetent or corrupt. In fact, recent allegations of corruption have led to turmoil in the Gotham PD, with officers being forced to resign, such as former Police Commissioner Loeb, and some are even faced with jail time. Yet the problem of corruption is not solved. There are still a lot of police officers in Gotham PD that take bribes from the mob in order to further their own personal gains. It is clear that something must be done in order to help clean out Gotham's police force and root out corruption in order to take the city back from these criminal gangs. However, how does the GPD do this? If the Gotham Police Force decides to go after this corruption, there will be repercussions.

Furthermore, there is also the problem of a lack of police officers in the GPD. With the reputation the police department has in Gotham, coupled with substandard work conditions and salary, it has made less and less people apply to the station each year. Due to this lack of police officers, Gotham PD is forced to hire anyone that applies, as there are not even enough cops to patrol the entire city. This leads to a negative cycle of more corruption, and thus less people applying, and more corrupt applicants getting hired. It is clear that Gotham PD has to rebrand itself if it wishes to increase the number of not only employees, but also good cops in service

Yet this is not the only problem our Police Department faces. The good cops that the police department does have can have a limited impact on the city due to a lack of resources. The police force has had budget cuts year after year due to a lack of efficiency. There are heaps of cases at Gotham PD that go overlooked. The police department that we do have is on its last legs. Old police cars, out-of-date technology and equipment, and even a worn-down office. It is clear that one way or another, this committee must find a way to acquire the

funds needed to create a better and more effective Gotham PD to tackle crime in the city.

Guiding Questions

- How can we effectively combat the corruption in Gotham's police force?
- What can we do to effectively utilize the minimal amount of resources we have in the Gotham PD? How can we gain more funds to increase our effectiveness as a police force?
- How do we increase the size of our police force and encourage people to join Gotham PD?

Topic #2: Rise of Crime

Over the years, our police department's control over the city has slowly diminished. Major crime mobs control some segments of the city, especially Upton Gotham, where some neighborhoods are rampant with crime. In fact, Old Gotham's "Crime Alley." The main problem with crime is that it is affecting the population disproportionately. The rich are able to walk away scott free while the poor suffer. Crime is also growing at an unprecedented rate in Uptown Gotham compared to Downton. Oftentimes people living in the Narrows do not have access to the services in place in areas such as Downton Gotham. This lack of funding in the region has led to many of its residents turning to crime in order to try and obtain some kind of money in order to sustain their families. This committee is highly encouraged to try and find a way to ensure the lower-class Gothamites have access to the same resources as those more fortunate.

Known immoral industries, such as Daggett Industries and ACE Chemicals are allowed to thrive in Gotham, while the honest people of Gotham suffer from the negative impacts they have on the city. ACE Chemicals, which is a known polluter, is allowed to dump toxic chemicals into the city's drinking supply, and makes it out unscathed with bribes to officers. Furthermore, through either incompetence, ignorance, or willingness - their chemicals have been known to get into the hands of known criminals - and villains - throughout the city, such as the infamous Joker. Daggett Industries on the other hand has been known to associate itself with known criminals and mobs, even hiring members of the Falconi and Marnoi families to help do its dirty work out on the street. The Gotham PD will have to get

some type of solid evidence against these corporations if it wishes to rid Gotham of corrupt individuals in power.

Furthermore, there is also the question of how strict the Gotham PD should uphold the law. Should first time offenders of small crimes be left off with a warning, or should they face the full extent of their crimes? This has been an ongoing question on the legal side of the Gotham PD, and one that needs an answer. In addition, the way the legal system deals with criminals has also come into question. Arkham Asylum, a place where we send our criminally insane to get rehabilitated, is known to only make criminals worse rather than better. Thus the question arises on how and if the Gotham PD should restructure our prisons to better help prisoners rather than strictly punish them.

Guiding Questions

- How should we combat the unequal distribution of the rise in crime in Gotham?
- Is our legal branch too harsh on first-time offenders? Should we reassess our current judicial means to take down criminals? Should we reassess our prison system?

Topic #3: The Batman

With the ineffectiveness of the Gotham PD being on full display, it has forced some people to resort to private police to keep them safe. The recent rumors of a masked vigilante, “Batman” seem to be giving people in the city hope of a world without crime. With the emergence of Batman in Gotham, it seems the crime rate seems to be slowly decreasing, and prominent criminals are getting arrested with evidence. Furthermore, although the official word is to “arrest the Batman on sight,” many police officers seem to have developed a friendship with him, with notable public figures, such as Jim Gordon, Harvey Bullock, Renee Montoya, Sonia Alcana, Harvey Dent, and Racheal Dawyes even working with him at times. However, this calls into the question if Gotham really wants to leave justice in the hands of citizens? There have been some calls for Batman to be arrested, as he is breaking numerous laws in his pursuit of justice. This also calls into question whether officials can “buy” police officers to help protect them, yet this would just further the income inequality in crime, furthering the divide between the Gotham elite and poor. Whether the

Gotham PD works with Batman is up to this committee, but it is clear that something must be done to solve the rise in crime throughout Gotham.

There is also the problem of copy cats of Batman arising. Less experienced superheroes who wish to spread the same message as this masked vigilante are often seen growing in number - which has caused a rise in deaths in vigilante-related incidents. Unlike Batman, these vigilantes have opted to use a more permanent method of putting criminals down, such as guns. This directly interferes with GPD investigations as criminals who need to be alive to testify to crimes are shot down by these vigilantes. In addition, a lot of them are unsuccessful in their mission and often just provide a nuisance to the police force as they are either at risk of getting themselves killed as they lack the experience to defend themselves in risky situations.

Moreover, GPD must also deal with escalation. That being that whenever the Gotham Police Department tries to introduce a solution to a problem, criminals come up with another challenge. Cops start carrying semi-automatics, they buy automatics. Cops start wearing Kevlar, and they buy armor piercing rounds. And now with Batman, the GPD is seeing a rise in "supervillains" - the criminally insane who believe they have to one-up the Dark Knight by causing even more problems. Some are simple and do it either for power or money, yet there are some who are villains just to cause chaos, such as Joker. Accepting Batman as an ally of the GPD will certainly create more of said villains.

Guiding Questions

- Should we team up with Batman to help us solve crimes, or arrest him for the crimes he has committed? Why?
- How should the GPD deal with the rise in supervillains of Gotham?

RESOURCES

When dealing with a fictional world with multiple universes, different media, and different iterations of the same character, things can get extremely confusing. That is why delegates should primarily use the background guide for information on this topic, as it contains a combination of information from comics, animated universe, and cinematic universe. If delegates really wish to immerse themselves in the Batman lore, the best extra resource for more information would be Christopher Nolan's Dark Knight Trilogy, however, as previously mentioned, most of the committee lore is a combination of various media of Batman.

Please note that if there is any contradicting information on the information posted here, that delegates are to consult the background guide for the committee lore. The following resources should be the ONLY resources outside of the background guide a delegate should consult, as the world of Batman deals with multiple different timelines, universes, and info on the same people.

Christopher Nolan's Dark Knight Trilogy

If delegates feel like the background guide is not enough information to give them a complete grasp of the Batman Universe, then we recommend watching Christopher Nolan's Dark Knight Trilogy. It provides an understanding of the origin of Batman, the nature of Gotham, and the prominent villains and criminals in Gotham. Please note that some of the information of the film has been edited in the Background Guide to better fit this committee. Yet most of this film ties in well with the committee lore, specifically the general culture and image of Gotham that will be portrayed in committee. This committee will take place sometime between Batman Begins and The Dark Knight.

Batman: The Long Halloween

If delegates prefer reading comics for their source material, then Batman: The Long

Halloween, which also provides an overview of the villains this committee will have to face, primarily the Falcone and Maroni family. Although some aspects of this comic are not accurate with the committee, specifically the relationship that Harvey Dent has and other minor details, most of the feeling of Gotham, and its villains, are fairly accurate.

Batman: Year One

If delegates are looking for more comics for more information, then Batman: Year One provides a perfect origin for this committee. Please note that some details of the story have been edited to better fit the committee. Primarily, it can be assumed that Batman in committee appeared much later in Jim Gordon's career, and by this point he is already commissioner. Furthermore, some of the people, such as Arnold Flask, have not been arrested and have only faced accusations. Although there are some discrepancies, this comic will provide with a GENERAL insight into Gotham life, and help familiarize yourself with Batman.
